A licensed Marriage and Family Therapist and Vietnam combat veteran, Dr. Cross is a certified Somatic Experiencing Practitioner (SEP), a Master Consultant and Trainer in the Trauma Resiliency Method (TRM) and the Community Resiliency Method (CRM). He is Emeritus Professor of Psychology at Onondaga Community College and an officer of Zen Center of Syracuse.

He is President of the Muslim Community Association of Mohawk Valley, the oldest Islamic Community in Utica, New York.
